

En hilsen fra Nordahl Grieg Presidenten

Hello Fellow Lodge Members:

How did it come about that there is a stave church in the Black Hills of South Dakota, thousands of miles from the lands where this type of architecture and construction originated? On July 9, I had the special opportunity to visit the exquisite Chapel in the Hills located in Rapid City, South Dakota.

The Chapel in the Hills in Rapid City is an exact replica of the famous Borgund Stavkirke in Lærdal, Norway. The Borgund Stavkirke was built around the year of 1150 and is considered the most completely preserved stave church still standing in Norway.

Chapel of the Hills in Rapid City was the dream of Reverend Harry Gregerson in the 1960's in order to expand the scope of his popular Lutheran radio ministry. Generous financial support from Arndt Dahl made this dream come true. Mr. Dahl's gift was in memory of his parents, as his father was a pioneering Lutheran pastor in the Midwest.

Since many of the original settlers of the Dakotas and surrounding states were Norwegian Lutherans, the idea was suggested that the chapel be built in the style of the original stave church (*stavkirke*). This would honor the local heritage and establish the chapel with strong cultural roots. The Norwegian Department of Antiquities graciously provided a set of blueprints of the Borgund Stavkirke in Norway to be used in the construction of the Chapel in the Hills. Beautiful wood carvings in the chapel are the result of a combined effort by Erik Fridstrom, one of Norway's best woodcarvers, and a local Rapid City resident, Hedge Christiansen. The chapel was built by Dilly Construction Company of Rapid City.

Other buildings on the property are an authentic grass-roofed *stabbur*, or storehouse, which was built in Norway, shipped to Rapid City, and reassembled on the grounds. It is now the visitor center and gift shop. Additionally, there are two residences, a parsonage, a church bell tower, and a caretakers cabin.

The chapel is used by visitors seeking a quiet place of contemplation, meditation, and prayer. Today the chapel sees 20,000 to 25,000 visitors a year and hosts evening worship services, weddings, vow renewals, and other services, all presided over by local Lutheran pastors. I hope you have a chance to go to Rapid City and visit Chapel in the Hills, the Black Hills, and all the other beautiful sites and scenery in that part of our country.

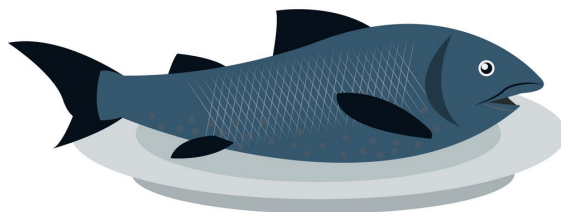

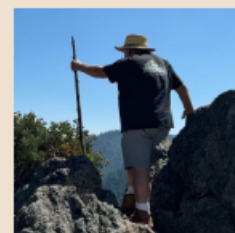
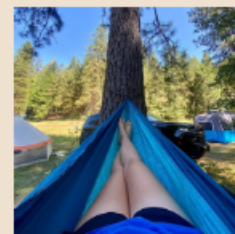

Watch Out For Fraudsters!

Protect yourself from emerging fraud trends

Staying informed about fraud trends is one of the best ways to protect your assets and personal information. Scammers are constantly changing their tactics, but the goal is always the same: to get you to hand over your money or sensitive data. Below are four types of scams that are actively targeting individual investors—and how to protect yourself.

1. Romance Baiting and Cryptocurrency Scams

In these emotionally manipulative scams, fraudsters form fake online relationships—sometimes lasting months—to build trust. Once the connection is established, they introduce a “can’t-miss” investment opportunity, often in cryptocurrency. Victims may see fake profits and feel encouraged to invest more. Eventually, they’re told they must pay taxes or fees before withdrawing any money. Then the scammer disappears.

- **Red flag:** An online friend or love interest begins recommending crypto investments.
- **Protect yourself:** If someone you’ve met online pushes an investment opportunity, stop communication and consult your financial advisor.

2. Imposter Scams

Scammers may pose as representatives from a bank, law enforcement, or a regulatory agency. They might claim your account has been compromised, your identity is linked to criminal activity, or that you must act fast to protect your funds. These schemes often pressure victims into wiring money, buying gift cards, or even physically handing over cash.

- **Red flag:** Pressure to take immediate action or to convert your funds into cash, crypto, or gold.
- **Protect yourself:** Hang up or delete the message. No legitimate agency will demand urgent action or payment in unusual forms.

3. Account Takeover

In account takeover scams, criminals obtain your login credentials—often through phishing emails or malware—and access your bank or investment accounts. Once inside, they can transfer money, make trades, or lock you out.

- **Red flag:** Unexpected login alerts, password changes, or missing funds.
- **Protect yourself:** Don’t click on suspicious links or download unknown software.

Always access your accounts by typing in the web address or calling your institution directly.

4. Tech Support and Remote Access Scams

Victims are contacted by phone, email, or popup claiming their device has been compromised. Scammers often pose as Microsoft or Apple tech support and ask to remotely access your computer. Once connected, they can install malware, steal personal data, or drain your bank accounts.

- **Red flag:** Messages urging you to click a link, install software, or share passwords.
- **Protect yourself:** Never grant remote access or share sensitive information with unsolicited contacts. If in doubt, call a trusted local technician for help.

Tips to Protect Yourself and Your Assets

- **Verify independently:** If you receive a suspicious message, contact the company or agency using a phone number or website you know is legitimate.
- **Take your time:** Scammers create urgency to prevent clear thinking. Pause and think before acting.
- **Strengthen your security:** Use multi-factor authentication (MFA), avoid reusing passwords, and review account activity regularly.
- **Report suspicious activity:** Notify your financial institution, advisor, or law enforcement if something doesn’t feel right.

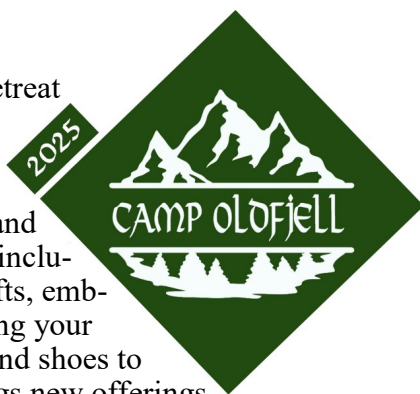

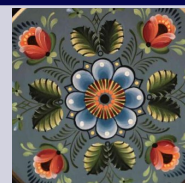
