Hello Fellow Lodge Members:

This month, I want to write about how important Nordahl Hall is to maintaining and growing our Lodge membership. Our Hall is our anchor. We have the luxury of using it for any of our functions, events, and programs throughout the year. Nordahl Hall has some great features: large banquet room, cozy feeling bar, accessible chairs and tables, fully functional kitchen with commercial grade appliances, and a good size parking lot.

Without Nordahl Hall, Nordahl Grieg Lodge would have to rent another space for our meetings and gatherings, and we would need a commercial kitchen for any food preparation. This would dramatically curtail, and most likely end our ability to sponsor events.

Other Lodges in the Bay Area have lost or sold their buildings over the years due to various reasons. Many Lodges are struggling to gain new members and their membership is dwindling rapidly.

It is really important that we not lose Nordahl Hall. The Nordahl Hall Board has embarked on a plan to repair and improve the look of our interior space in order to help increase our rental income. Our building has not had major improvements for nearly 40 years. The interior is looking tired, old, and out of date. Young people and families want neutral colors and an attractive well-maintained space for their celebrations of important milestones. These renters want their photos to be stunning. Businesses, organizations, and clubs are looking for clean modern bathrooms, and comfortable well-maintained meeting areas.

We are starting our improvements now, and soon will be installing contemporary vanities, new countertops, sinks, faucets, and large mirrors in both bathrooms. We thank the Solveig Club for their donation to make this happen. The foyer interior doors and trim have been painted to lighten that area, and planning is underway to replace the foyer tile with a contemporary style and lighter color.

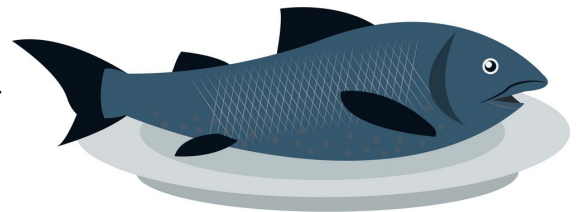
