Greetings Fellow Lodge Members:

It is already December, with many of us already planning for holiday gatherings and festivities. We have been busy preparing for our biggest fundraiser of the year coming up on December 6. Did you know that there are over 100 volunteers that have been working hard on preparations, and will work hard on December 6, so that our **Lutefisk and Meatball Dinner is an enjoyable experience for everyone?** We truly hope that those of you attending enjoy the evening.

Here are some fun facts about our dinner:

- Our Lutefisk is fresh frozen on the ship and caught in the pristine waters of Alaska. It's purchased from a premier fishery located in Washington state. *No longer do we purchase cod soaked in lye and rehydrated like the olden days.*
- Our meatballs are handmade from high quality beef and pork with special spices. We have been using the same meatball recipe for over 35 years!
- Our lefse is made with over 200 pounds of real mashed potatoes. Nearly 900 rounds were rolled this year. Our lefse recipe has been used for over 40 years!
- We make our own traditional krumkake and Dahlman almond cookies, and have added Anna's Ginger Swedish Thins. We have over 3,000 cookies for our dinner.

Updated foyer and restrooms: When you arrive to attend our Lutefisk Dinner, please notice our updated restroom vanities, new foyer tile, updated women's lounge, and fresh foyer paint. We are serious about upgrading Nordahl Hall. 



MODERNIZE OUR HALL FLOOR

Fundraising Goal: \$35,000

Thank you for your interest in our “Modernize Our Hall Floor” fundraiser. We are asking for your help to make a special contribution to our Love Your Lodge fund specifically for replacing our 1990s hall and bar flooring.

Why do we need a fundraiser? We must rent Nordahl Hall to support the costs of running a building – insurance, utilities, supplies, roof repairs, property management costs, and maintenance. Our current annual rental income does not fully cover these costs, so we are unable to save money for capital improvements such as floor replacements or other major improvements.

Why is rental income lower than we need? We have feedback from our event planner and other potential renters that our building looks tired and out of date. Clients who plan a wedding, fancy party, or catered dinner want their professional photos to be stunning. Our floor detracts from those photos.

What are we doing to improve the Hall? The Nordahl Hall Board has embarked on a plan to improve the look of our interior and exterior space in order to attract more renters to increase our income. Here is what we have done to improve our space this year with donations, and with many volunteers’ hard work:

- Women’s and men’s restroom improvements were completed in September 2025.
- Foyer interior doors and trim were painted in August to lighten that area.
- Tile floor in the foyer and ladies’ lounge has been replaced with a contemporary style in a lighter color.
- Earlier this spring, the parking lot walls and rear storage containers were painted.
- In May, we planted a new garden including paver stones, and installed a new irrigation system.
- We replaced bar baseboards, and installed a new bar plumbing system.

We are VERY SERIOUS about upgrading Nordahl Hall!

Open Village Experience

The cruise company Hurtigruten is taking a new approach to tourism and has an intriguing new offering. Tourists will have the chance to visit three villages on the coast and get to experience everyday life in these places. The stopovers include: Træna, Bessaker and Sæbø. The voyages will be offered from May to September and guests can experience activities such as church concerts, guided town tours, live music, and homemade treats.

One of the reasons this new offering is so innovative is that the cruise company will be contributing 250 Norwegian kroner per guest to each community visited, which is a major benefit for the people and businesses that reside there. Additionally, the idea also helps the problem of overtourism in the most visited destinations.
