From Scotland's Tartan Army taking over Boston with bagpipe parades, drinking the bars dry and running out of food, to Norway's Viking Row Chant on escalators, in plazas, and on the fields, to Japanese supporters showing discipline by cleaning up stadium trash, and other foreign visitors and locals taking over our cities' downtowns with dancing and team chants. Foreign fans have been touched by the hospitality of local Americans, are in awe of the food portions at restaurants, amazed by the grandeur of our scenery, and are loving to experience unique American culture and food.



The organizers of the 2026 World Cup and the cities and venues that held matches, did an amazing job to ensure that the teams and fans felt welcome by having their flags and anthems everywhere. The stadiums were in tip top shape, with top notch technology, organized exciting field performances, dramatic flyovers, and cool firework displays. 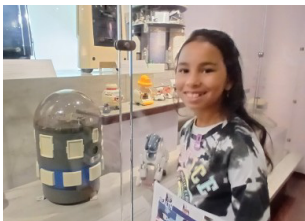

2026 District Convention Delegate Report

The 2026 District 6 Convention was held Fri-Sun, June 12-14 in Sacramento. The best part of this convention was on Friday, when the delegates and officers of the district were transported on a couple of buses up to Camp Norge in Alta, CA. It was about an hour ride up there and even the bus ride was fun. Personally, it was my first visit to Alta in over 30 years. Yeah, shame on me!

The convention contingent was offered several different tours of the site upon our arrival (after the raising of the flags and the national anthems), followed by homemade Lapskaus (Norwegian stew). The afternoon had a couple of sessions with multiple activities (hikes, arts & crafts, storytelling, party at the pool) including an outstanding presentation by the History Expeditions team (<https://historyexp.org/>) about Snowshoe Thompson and the history of his famous delivery route from Placerville, CA to the east side of the Sierra Nevada, where he often ended his delivery at Genoa, NV. They reprised his entire journey as an expedition team in March 2024. This team of high performance/endurance athletes were amazed at how quickly Thompson made his twice a month (usually) deliveries, as he didn't bring anything to weigh him down, like camping equipment, food (besides a few healthy snacks), or water. He also only stopped along the way for a few 15-minute naps. Amazing stuff. And, skis in Norway were called "snowshoes" which is how he got his nickname (not because he wore what we nowadays would call snowshoes).

All in all, a great trip to kick off the convention. Most of the delegates (many from SoCal, NV, AZ and CO) had never been to Alta and were awestruck. The camp is in great shape and the event was well organized and thought out. A shoutout to **Fred Hymans**, the Rec Center President, and his team. TUSEN TAKK!!

There really wasn't a lot of "meat" to this convention. Some decent (but not great) presentations about lodge activities and marketing lodges, etc. Not a lot to take home from these though. One recommendation was all lodges should find a way to accept credit/debit cards or electronic transfers (Zelle, Venmo) for events rather than relying on checks or cash. All the financial reports were approved (district and Rec Center are doing okay), and most of the resolutions (11 in total) were simple corrections/updates to the bylaws.

There was also a presentation by Liese Greensfelder who, as a young college grad from California, wanted to go work on a Norwegian farm for a year. She arrived with no money, no farm skills, and a language barrier (she did speak Danish). When she got there, she found the farm owner in the hospital after suffering a stroke, and wound up running the entire farm for the year, as the ornery owner spent most of the year in the hospital or in rehab at home. She suffered horribly early on learning what needed to be done as the farm had crops and many sheep, and then figuring out how to do it. She eventually did learn and wound up loving the experience. The national news found out about her and featured her story, including a magazine cover picture. She wrote a book, which I haven't read yet but sounds fascinating - [Accidental Shepherd: How a California Girl Rescued an Ancient Mountain Farm in Norway](#).

There was also a folk art exhibition and vendor sales so lots of Norwegian stuff was available if you wanted some. Always some really good stuff. Think of the Solvig Room at Lutfisk times 3 or 4.

The partnership with Better Life - There were a couple of senior leaders from Better Life at the convention and their president gave a short presentation at the convention. Ultimately, the Sons of Norway needed this partnership/merger, really, in order to survive. The financial picture at a business level has been struggling for quite a few years. Better Life is a similar structure, both from insurance and fraternal standpoints but is in a much better financial position. FYI – Better Life was formed when Czech and Slovak heritage fraternal organizations merged. Ultimately, I don't think much, if anything, will change at a local lodge level or even a district level. If you are a financial benefit member of Sons of Norway, nothing will be changing there either. Personally, me, Scott Ansok, I have no concerns about the merger. Recreation Center – **Fred Hymans**, Rec Center President, led this informational and entertaining session updating the delegates about the ongoings at the Rec Center. Lots of activities and efforts have been happening and online reservations for camp sites is now how you book your stay. Good stuff. The Hygge Hus (“cozy house” in Norwegian) is a relatively new effort to provide two separate, wheelchair accessible cabins for elderly and disabled members and guests to enjoy the camp. **Fred** had a goal to raise \$28,800 at the convention. Between lodge and personal donations, it was up to over \$25,000 raised. Then an anonymous donation came in for ~\$3,000 to reach the goal of \$28,800. Also, our own **Jim Sturtevant** was elected to the Rec Center Board! Congrats, **Jim**!

Lodge Merit Awards – these awards are based on a number of factors, including membership gains, retention, participation, community involvement, # of and type of lodge activities, etc. Nordahl Grieg was awarded Gold Merit Awards (highest) for both 2024 and 2025! The Certificates of Recognition for these awards were presented at the Ice Cream Social to the presidents for those years, **Kathy** and **Sheryl**. Congrats to them and all of Nordahl Grieg for this achievement.

Overall, it was a successful convention and I think all the Nordahl Grieg delegates enjoyed it. On behalf of all of us - **Scott Ansok**, **Fred Hymans**, **Janie Kelly** (who also served as the Convention Parliamentarian), **Judy Purrington**, **Barbara Shoup**, and **Jeannie Thomson** – thank you to the lodge for voting us in as delegates and for the \$600 stipend to help offset the costs.
